Forest Home Diabetes Policy



CAMPER GUIDELINES/RESTRICTIONS

- Diabetic campers that attend Forest Home must have been vetted through the Nurse camp.
- A camper must have been diagnosed with diabetes for a minimum length of time:
 - o Wild Rock 1 year
 - o Creekside -1 year
 - o Lakeview-1 year
 - o Family Camp no restriction
- There are no restrictions on the number of non-insulin-dependent diabetics per camp
- In most circumstances, there may be a maximum of two insulin-dependent diabetics per camp unless a specified nurse with diabetic education is available and willing
- Campers must have stable blood sugars and must understand how to adjust their insulin based on carbohydrate intake and the amount of exercise performed
- Parents will provide an Independent Diabetic Action Plan to the Nurse Manager one week prior to their camper arriving to camp
- For insulin dependent campers, parents will send a Glucagon injectable with their camper

CAMP REQUIREMENTS

- Campers must check in with the Camp Nurse upon arrival at camp to review supplies and orders.
- Campers must be self-sufficient in counting carbohydrates, administering insulin, and managing overall care of their diabetes
- The camper will be responsible for always carrying own supplies on them
- ALL INSULIN DEPENDENT DIABETICS MUST BE ON A MONITORING SYSTEM (e.g., Dexcom)
- ALL INSULIN DEPENDENT DIABETICS MUST BE RECEIVING INSULIN FROM AN INSULIN PUMP OR BE ABLE TO CALCULATE, DRAW UP, AND ADMINISTER THEIR OWN INSULIN

INDEPENDENT CAMPER ALTERNATIVE

• In the event that a camper is unable to manage his/her diabetes independently and requires guidance/supervision to count carbs, assess blood sugar, and administer insulin; the camper must have a **PARENT** who comes to camp with the camper, is with the camper at all times, and assumes <u>ALL</u> responsibility for managing and medicating the camper in accordance with the physician's diabetic orders for that camper.
